Housing Options




- Integrated part of housing/hln service about access to housing (and other services?)
 Initial diagnostic interview
- Person-focused, individual
- Impartial
- Partnerships/referral routes with PRS, RSLs, support providers, local services etc
- Linking need, aspiration & options across all tenures
- Outcomes focused...

Housing Options 🗶




- Does not replace statutory duties
- Should not put people in unsustainable housing
- Outcomes should not be driven by
- Delivering radically different level of service in different areas
- Be gate-keeping





Prevention + crisis response

- Different delivery models but should have core elements
- Retain the homeless statutory safety net not 'two routes'
- Integrated with progressive prevention, early intervention and a corporate approach to housing problems.
- Excellent customer service/good communication





Service user priorities

- To know where to go in a crisis
- To be seen quickly
- Information to be correct/realistic
- To be treated with dignity and respect
- To offer help and solutions, not barriers
- Good communication at all stages ideally one key worker
- Practical next steps to get a safe home
- Support in new tenancy
